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The purpose of 4-H is to help boys and girls learn and develop—knowledge, skills, attitudes. The 4-H proj-Document ects, meetings, and activities with the guidance of leaders provide the learning experiences for this development.

Most 4-H publications and certain other 4-H materials are provided by the Oregon State University Extension Service through county Extension offices to enrolled 4-H leaders and members. A few items must be purchased.

4-H materials are not generally available to the public except that teachers and leaders of other youth groups may request single copies of most items. A few items are available for sale to the public.
