#### **Description of the Proposed Action:**

KOTI plans to add onto existing building and new equipment, with a 6' x 5' x 6.2' enclosure mounted on a concrete pedestal and attached to an existing comm. building. They will use existing 130' tower. 10'x10' square buried ground wire loop. No grading necessary. There will be approximately a 2 week installation timeframe during June 2004.
