- no textbooks, no e-books, no standards or conferences, no award winning fiction, no microform/film, no dissertations, no A/V

buy request: 64% - 1 or less; 35% - 2 or more; 16% - 3 or more
traditional: 92% - 1 or less; 7% - 2 or more; 2% - 3 or more

Circulation Rank by Call

buy request: Q>H>T>P>Rtraditional: H>Q>B>P>T

Item Cost per Circulation

buy request: \$39.59 vs. ILL: \$31

• any additional circulations will decrease item cost/circ
