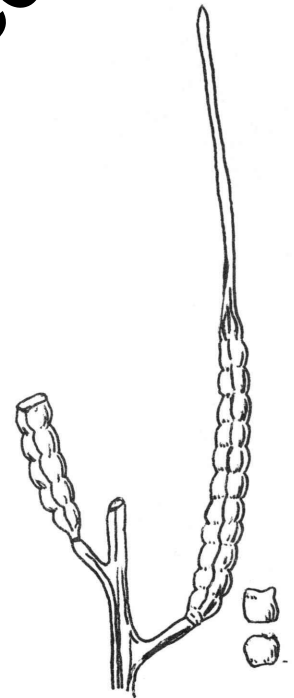
Annual

Flowers purple

Mature plant 5 to 20 inches tall

Seeds embedded in pod

Pod breaks into pieces upon maturity



Purple mustard is an annual, sometimes called blue mustard. It is found in cultivated fields and along roadsides.

Control: 1/4 pound Linuron + 3/16 pound bromoxynil or 3/8 pound bromoxynil-MCPA (Bronate or Brominal Plus).
