Notice was given on December 4, 1951 by the Army Engineers of application by the Evans Products Company, Coos Bay, Oregon for a permit to dredge in Coalbank Slough at Coos Bay, Oregon.

The site for the proposed work is well upbay from any shellfish populations of importance, at least two miles from the nearest clam beds of the soft-shell clam, Mya arenaria. There can be seen no objection to this work project as far as the shellfish resources of the State are concerned.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Application has been made to the Department of the Army by the Evans Products Company, Coos Bay, Oregon for a permit to dredge in Coalbank Slough at Coos Bay, Oregon.

The site for the proposed work is on the left (northwest) bank of Coalbank Slough beginning 100 feet upstream from the Southern Pacific company railway bridge, and extending about 600 feet upstream. The entire dredging area is landward from the mean lower low water line. Material will be excavated to four feet below mean lower low water, and will be deposited landward from the high water line.

Maps and plans for the works are on file and may be seen in this office.

Letters expressing views concerning the effect of the proposed work on navigation are requested from all interested parties, particularly navigation interests and State and local authorities. Replies to receive full consideration should be received in this office prior to December 17, 1951.
