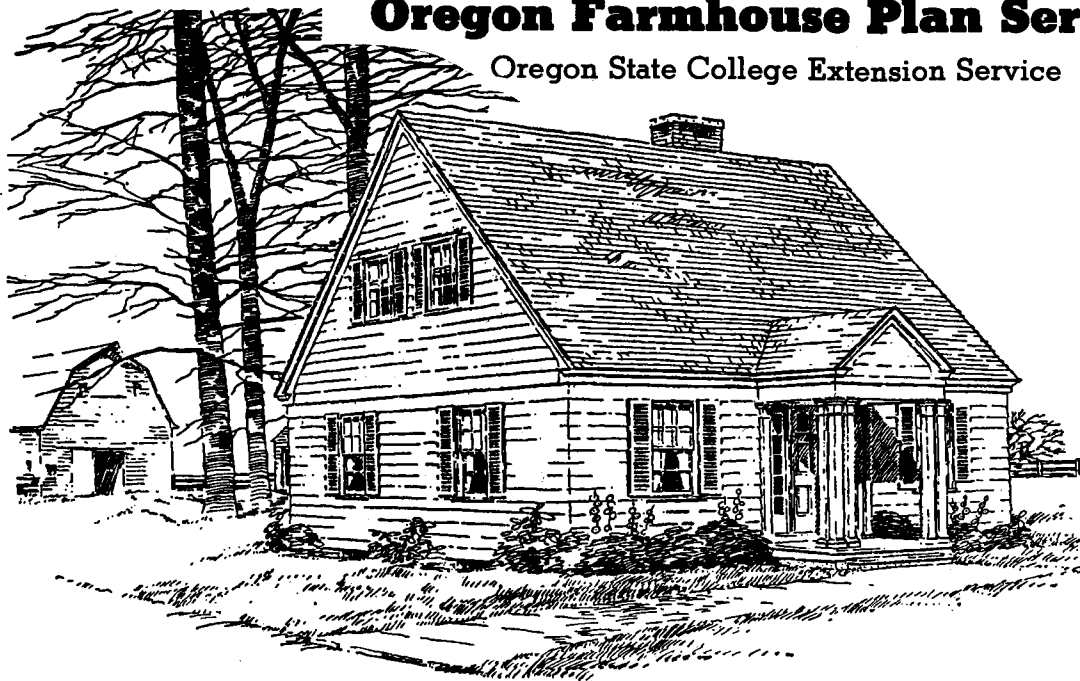

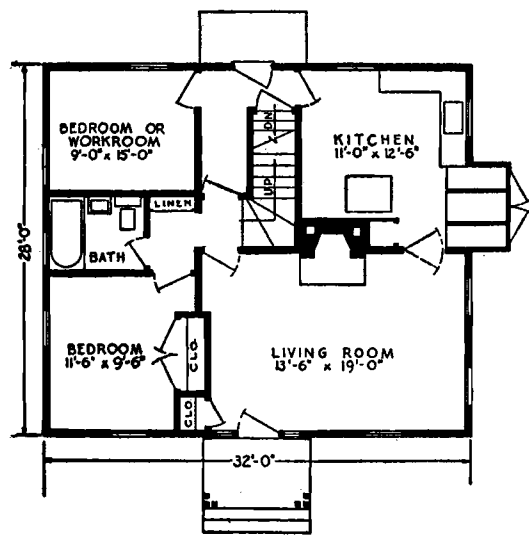
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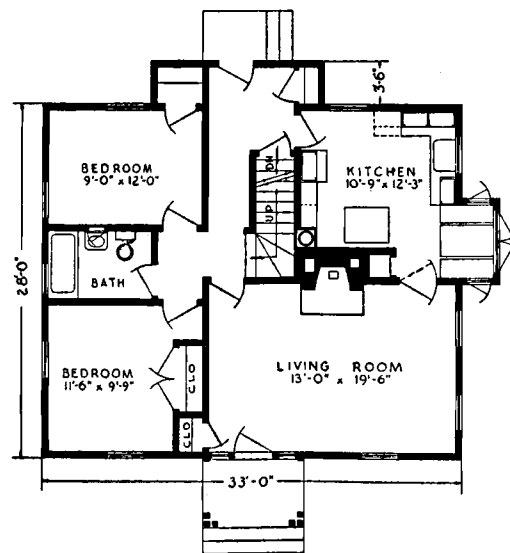
SECOND-FLOOR PLAN

## 6-ROOM FARMHOUSE

Two plans are shown. The alternate plan provides additional space and closets at the rear entrance which adds to convenience. The rear bedroom on both plans may be converted into a workroom by omitting the hall partition. One feature of this house is the large amount of space available for sleeping quarters. Two extra bedrooms can be provided in the attic whenever needed. Where the family is large more dining space might be provided by enlarging the dining alcove. A flat roof on the dining room would provide a sleeping and sunning space. The full basement provides space for storage, heating equipment, and laundry work. For mild or cold localities.
