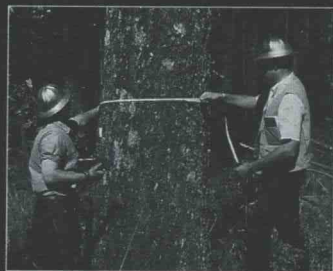

How can we help you?

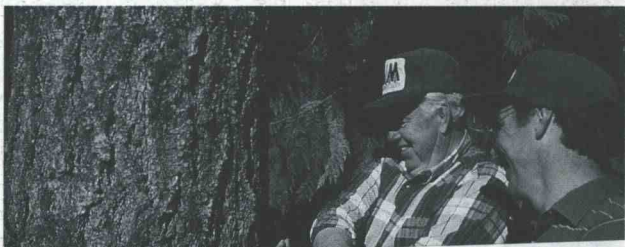

The face of Oregon's timber industry is changing. Our programs will help you adapt to the future.

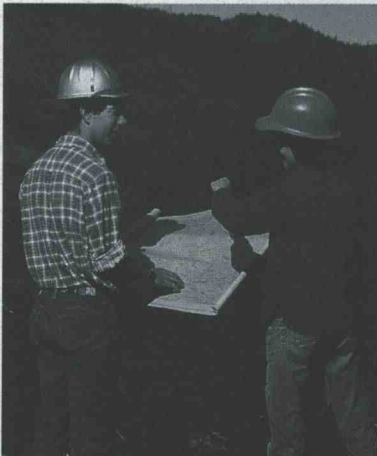
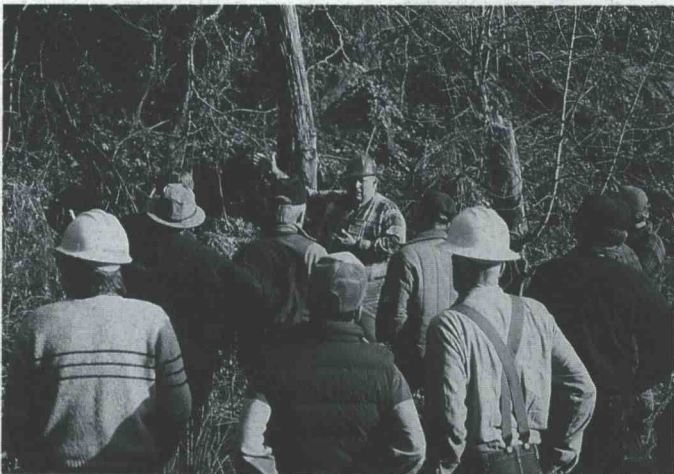
- **Education.** Logger education to help you become an "applied ecologist."

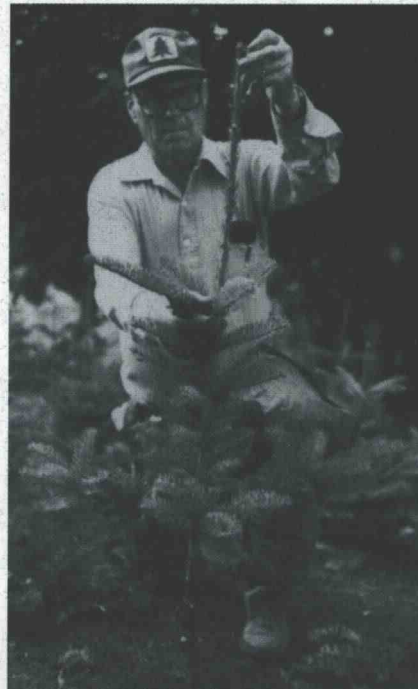
- **Radio programs.** A pilot program using low power radio technology speaks to motorists as they travel through our forests.
