This is in addition to the other prizes offered. Keep on with your work even if your Club has disbanded. Don't be a "quitter", but stay in the "game" to the end.

I should like to visit every Club member this summer, but since there are over 10,000 of you and only one of me, such a visit becomes an impossibility. I am hoping, however, that I shall be able to meet you at your County Fair or at the State Fair.
