

Comments concerning Page 1, "Plan Conformance":

The project is in conformance with the Klamath Falls Resource Area Record of Decision and Resource Management Plan (ROD/RMP) (1995). However, the dates of grazing use in the grazing lease (May 1 to August 30) differ from those listed in the ROD/RMP (May 1 to August 1). When the RMP was written, it proposed livestock use reductions, but did not make the decision to do so. "All changes to these and other attributes of livestock grazing management will be made through the monitoring and evaluation process as outlined in the section *Rangeland Monitoring and Evaluation*" (ROD/RMP Page H-1).

An evaluation of monitoring has not been completed. Thus the season of use dates remain as shown in the grazing lease (i.e., May 1 to August 30).
