Design & Methods

Study Design: stratified random sample, panel & cross-section data

Stratified random sample of survey locations

72 locations selected from a total of 256 across San Diego County, divided into 4 strata

Panel Data: Six bimonthly visits from Sept 2015 – Aug 2016


Data recorded for all non-frozen seafood products and all frozen shrimp products:

- Species name*
- Price
- Production method
- Condition at sale
- Country of harvest
- All additional labeling: Keywords, eco-labels, etc.


Cross-sectional Data: August 2016

Data recorded for ALL seafood products in each market, including Frozen, Canned, Prepared, Shelf Stable, and other refrigerated products.






Average prices of eco-labeled & non-labeled products of same species (6X)





In Theory: One policy instrument per externality, unless the externalities are closely linked enough.

In Practice: Is an ecolabel enough to address both the bycatch and the information externalities?





Price of Seafood Products by Trophic Level and Eco-Label 6 visits x 72 markets, all species, all labels (n = 12,865)








