


Little Bur

Scientific name: Ranunculus testiculatus Common name: Horned-head buttercup

Seed cases "horned".

Flowers yellow

Height, 1 to 7 inches

Leaves basal

Root shallow



Little bur is a conspicuous roadside covering, well distributed east of the Cascades. This plant is of little importance as a pest but is frequently submitted for identification.

Control: 1 pound MCPA ester per acre gives fair control.
