Apple ermine moth, Yponomeuta mallinellus Zeller; apple, Malus domestica L.

Parasitism of the apple ermine moth, *Yponomeuta malinellus* and the recently introduced cherry ermine, Y. padellus, was determined at several localities in western Washington for the eighth year. The introduced parasite *Ageniaspis fuscicollis* has spread up to 20 k from release sites and at localities near release sites parasitism averaged 20% in 1994-1995. The pupal parasitoid *Herpestomus brunicornis* was recovered for the second year in a row, 4 years since its last introduction. Parasitism by Ageniaspis fuscicollis is shown for 24 sites studied for 3 or more years.
