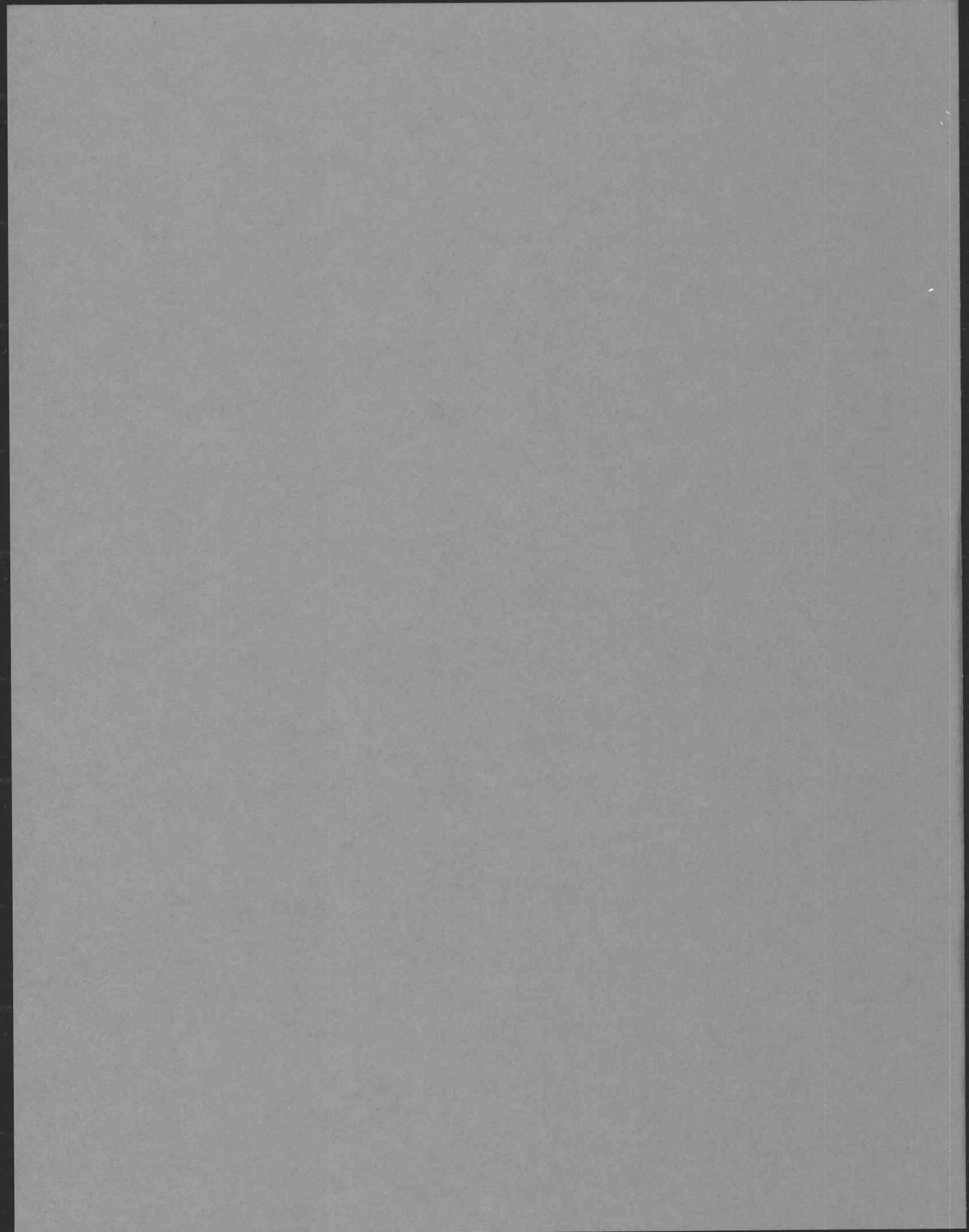

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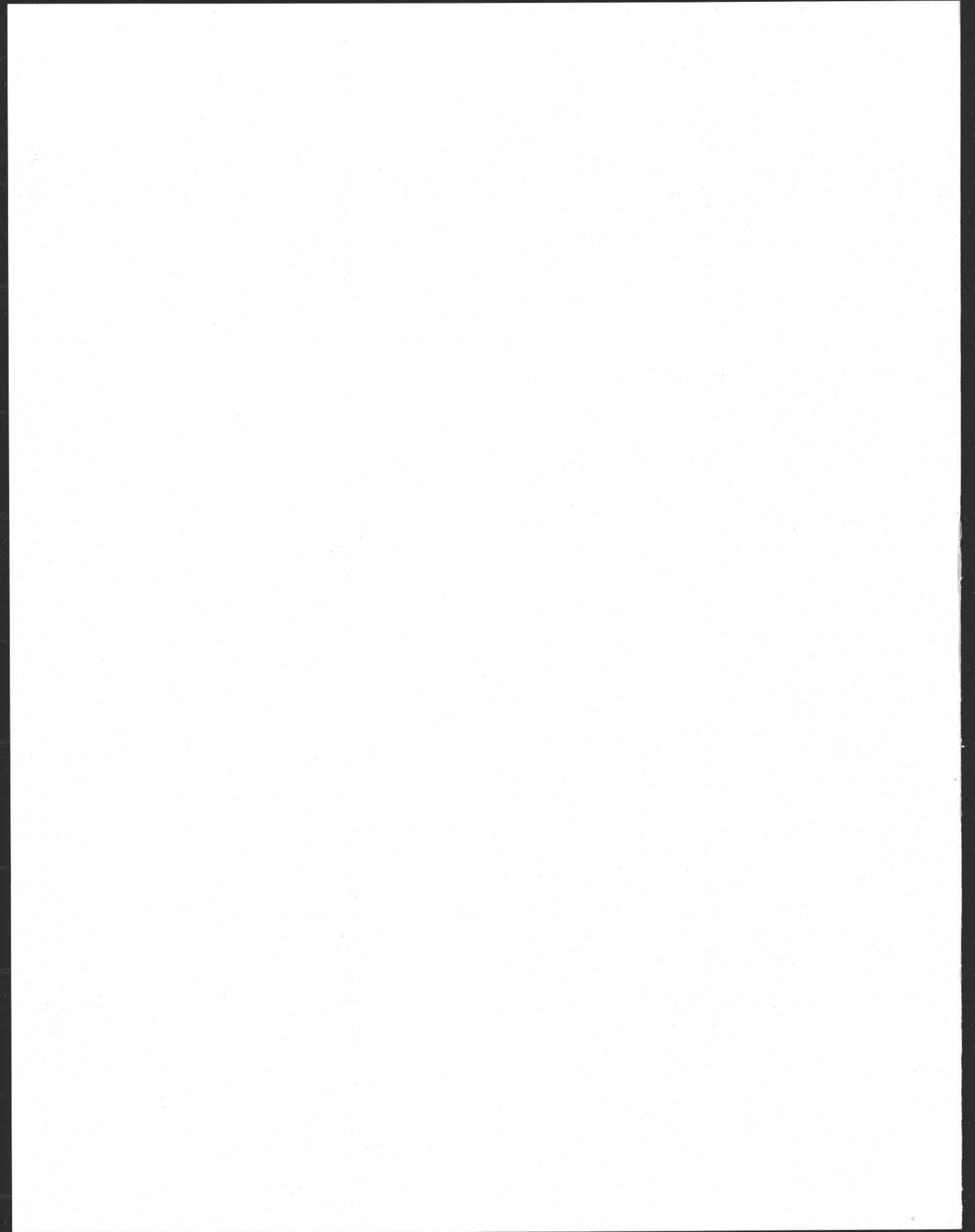
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## INTRODUCTION

This list is a continuation of the work begun by Oregon State University Librarians who compiled the first list in the 1950's. Since that time many lists have been issued and several are now out of print. However, it is hoped that by late 1978 the Oregon State University Press will be able to offer all of the lists which cover forestry theses written since 1900.

Each PhD dissertation is followed by a (P), while each Master's thesis is followed by an (M). Most colleges and universities will lend their Master's theses via inter-library loan, but copies of PhD dissertations normally must be purchased as microfilms or photocopies from University Microfilms International, Dissertation Copies, P. O. Box 1764, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48106.

An author index and a subject index follow the main listing of theses. The entry numbers in the indexes refer to theses numbers rather than to page numbers.
