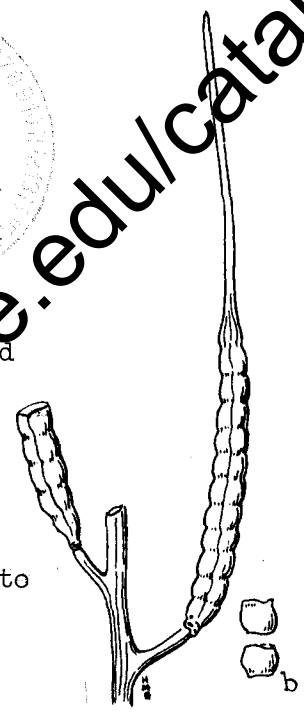

Purple mustard is an annual, sometimes called blue mustard. It is found in cultivated fields and along roadsides.

Control: Seedling plants start in flat, leafy rosettes. Early treatment assures best control. For plants up to 3 inches across, use 3/4 pound 2,4-D ester per acre. For larger plants increase to 1 1/4 pounds. Spray as early as grain growth will permit.
