 - The Registry of Open Access Repositories (ROAR) includes links to and data about the repositories of the world (http://roar.eprints.org/)
- Want to make changes to your next Copyright Transfer Agreement?
 - From Science Commons, the Scholar's Copyright Addendum Engine lets you customize the addenda to your needs – not limited to self-archiving (http://scholars.sciencecommons.org/)
 - From SPARC (Scholarly Publishing and Academic Resources Coalition), Authors'
 Rights information and a pre-made addendum

- The SHERPA/RoMEO database provides information about the self-archiving policies of journal publishers (http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/)
