Title: Bioeconometrics: Empirical Modeling of Bioeconomic Systems

Abstract: This paper provides a working definition of bioeconometrics and a

taxonomy of model types. A bioeconometric model is an empirical model of a bioeconomic system in which quantitative changes in one or more parameters can affect the qualitative behavior of the dynamical system. Bioeconometric model types include equilibrium,
