## Accreditation Status Confirmed for the College of Veterinary Medicine

The American Veterinary Medical Association Council on Education reviewed the College's 2008 interim report and reported that they voted to continue full accreditation for Oregon State University's College of Veterinary Medicine. They also noted that they are removing substantial compliance for Standard 3 Physical Facilities and Equipment.

They commended the College for the completion of the large animal isolation facility in response to the deficiency cited in past reports. The completion of the facility along with posting isolation protocols answers the recommendations made by the Council in 2007. The College was granted full accreditation for seven years in 2007 and is now in full compliance with all standards.

## Safe Capture short course to be held at the College of Veterinary Medicine

The College of Veterinary Medicine will be hosting a short course on Remote Anesthesia/Chemical Immobilization on Apr. 18-19. It will be presented by Safe-Capture International, Inc. and will focus on zoo and free-ranging wildlife species.

This workshop is approved for one college credit at OSU, and full-time students enrolled in veterinary medicine, wildlife biology, or other related sciences will be able to attend at a reduced rate.

## Elisha Adkins secures 2009 Dairy Internship at Columbia River Dairy



One of only three chosen, Elisha Adkins ('12) will be spending the summer of 2009 immersed in milk, so to speak. She and two animal sciences students have been accepted as interns at the Columbia River Dairy in Boardman, Ore. The Columbia River Dairy milks 16,000 cow each day and has an affiliated heifer and steer raising program at their facilities.

The main purpose of the internship is to familiarize the intern with all the major areas of dairy management by participating in the day-to-day work. To accomplish this, Elisha will work closely with the supervisors, herd managers and veterinarians in the reproduction, milking, and herd management departments, as well as at the heifer-raising facility. She will learn the systems that are used to manage cattle, maintain productivity, and prevent disease on a large dairy facility.

In addition to learning the daily grind, she'll be collecting data in a given area that will be used to help improve management. The project will be designed to accommodate the needs of the farm and the interests of the student.

In addition to receiving a daily wage and learning invaluable information, Elisha will also receive a \$5,000 scholarship.
