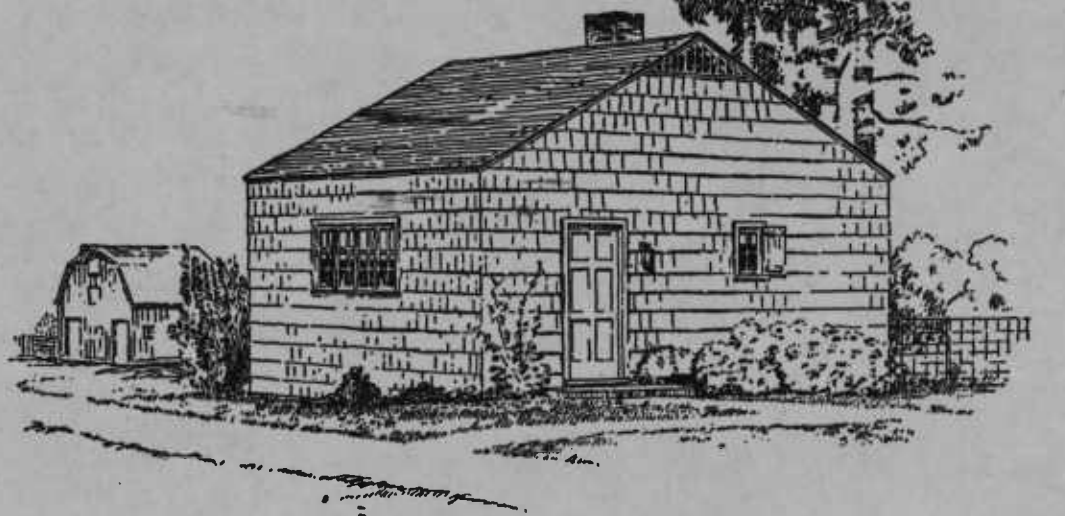
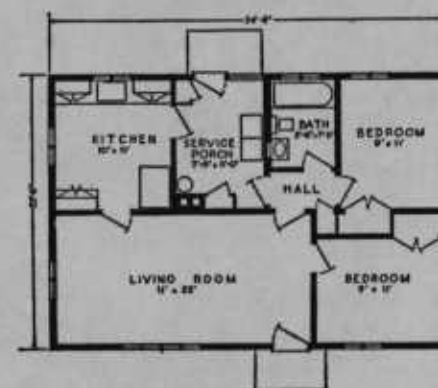

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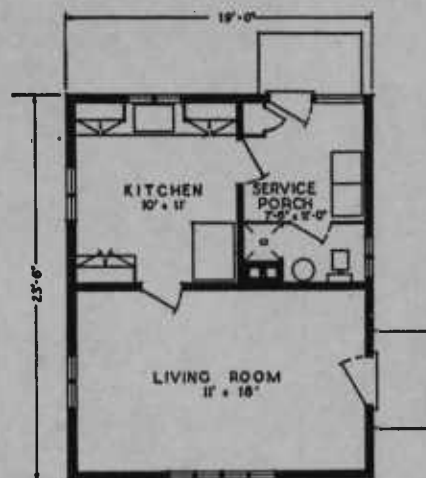

The three-room house shown on the left is conveniently arranged for a small family; a folding couch in the living room could be used for a bed. The chimney with two flues permits the use of stoves in the kitchen and in the living room; a fireplace could be built. The three-room unit may be enlarged as shown on the right. In the plan for the larger house the service porch permits entry to all rooms without going through

the kitchen and provides for laundry equipment, water heater, and two closets. The living room could be used for a dining room on occasions when the kitchen would be too small. No provision is made for a basement since above-ground storage can be provided economically. The exterior may be of wood shakes, horizontal siding, or stucco. For mild or cold localities.
