Wild Oats

Scientific name: *Avena fatua*
Common names: Wheat oats, oat grass

Annual

Resembles oats but has
a more open panicle

Awns blackish, twisted,
and bent

Seed shatters readily
at maturity

Wild oats is found in grain fields, pasture, and trashy areas. Troublesome mostly in the Northwest and western Canada.

Control: Spray with 1 1/4 pounds of Avadex per acre. This is a pre-plant treatment. Avadex needs to be tilled into the soil before seeding.
