Oregon State University currently has a 130-member Faculty Senate, which represents about 2,200 faculty. Its bylaws were first adopted in 1956, but its current administrative arrangement was established in 1978. The Faculty Senate is responsible for determining and establishing the purposes of Oregon State University; it assumes responsibility for the creation, maintenance, and protection of the University environment; and it provides the means by which the administration may be apprised of representative opinion of the entire Faculty.

The vision for the Oregon State University Faculty Senate continues to be one of providing safeguards for faculty in the areas of academic freedom. It ensures that faculty have a role in providing input in program development, reduction or redirection and it continues to strive for shared governance in the areas that directly affect faculty. It also continues to provide formal recommendations on areas that affect faculty at the University. It is the vision of the leaders of this organization that the Senate will continue to be involved with substantial issues that are of concern to Oregon State and its faculty and that through continued participation, members of the Faculty will become involved in the important issues that face higher education.
