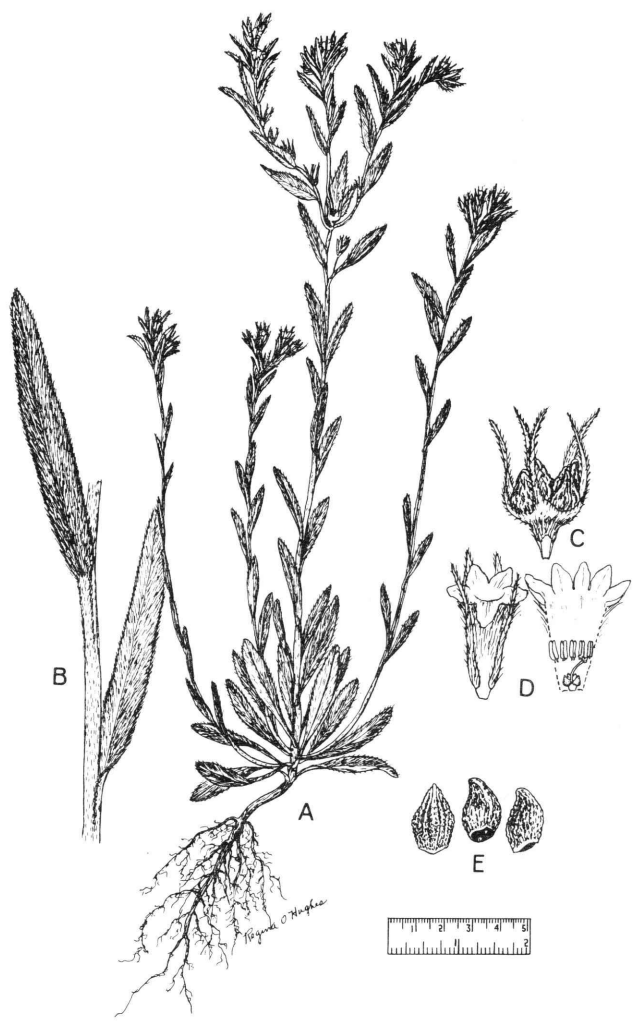

Annual

Stems erect

Mature plant 4 to 30 inches tall

Leaves alternate, long and narrow, hairy on both sides

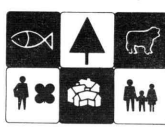
Flowers white

Tap root

Seeds four in a cluster

Corn Gromwell is found mainly in grain fields, is very resistant to 2,4-D.

Control: 1/2 pound linuron (Lorox) or 3/4 pound terbutryn (Igran) or 3/8 pound bromoxynil-MCPA (Bronate or Brominal-Plus).
