Description of the Proposed Action:

Project activities will include creation of log and rock structures along the bank of Willow Valley Reservoir. All enhancement sites will be located below high water mark. Some sites may be inundated with water at time of treatment. Installation will include attaching boles of juniper trees to large boulders via cable and Hilti glue, or attaching tree boles to large concrete anchors with cable and cable clamps. Trees will be delivered to anchor sites via wheeled/tracked yarders, floating barges, or moved by hand (refer to map for method and location of use). Yarding equipment will use pre-designated routes to limit adverse impacts to vegetation and banks. All cultural sites will be avoided. Boulder anchor points will be drilled using hand held Hilti-drills or other similar hand held rock boring equipment. Staging areas for tree boles will be at the boat launch facility and at the northwest arm of the lake where a road reaches the edge of the high water (see map locations). Sheared juniper tree will be collected from fuels and range improvement treatment sites along accessible roads within the general vicinity of the Willow Valley area and will be transported to staging areas via a self loading log truck.

No implementation on the ground will occur until surveys and clearances are completed. Cultural specialists have conducted initial site reviews and provided some feedback on locations to avoid. Additional cultural surveys will be conducted prior to project implementation, when sites for habitat treatment have been finalized.
